One of my students wrote a very touching letter regarding Don. He said that it affected him more than he knew. He was very surprised as he didn't know the man, only admired him. One thing he said really caught my attention and I wanted to share it with you. He writes:

"When I look at Don, and listen to him, and how good he is, it just makes me think-you know-I can never see myself being even 1/100th as good as that. And then I'm annoyed at myself for not putting in as much effort as I should be in the down-time between our lessons and stuff."

My response to him was that he was comparing himself to one of the greatest voice talents of our time. Don has a voice and style that is admired by all, but I'm sure if you were to hear his first demo, learn of his struggles (as there were some), his efforts, his dedication, his creativity - he had a major hand in creating movie trailers, not just voicing them. If you were to hear everyones story, you would know that they too had to work very hard. I loved what Eric said in our Editor section...the top coaches attending VOICE 2008 were sitting in as students. Don set out and created the work himself instead of waiting for the work to come to him. That's exactly what we must do. Once you've put in the amount of years

and efforts that the top have put in, then you can start comparing to them. In the mean time, compare yourself only to YOU!

Don worked hard for what he created. We can do this too....one world....one voice......one YOU......and one DON! The world of voice isn't about competition, it's about individual success. Don't compare, find your own identity. Hard work, dedication and passion will get you great success, just as it did for Don!

Special thanks to Julie Williams for forwarding us Don's letter. Don explains his condition so eloquently and leaves us with a lasting message for all to hear. This may be hard to read after the fact but for those of you that want to know exactly what happened, it's all in here.

"I thought it was about time that I brought everybody up to speed with what's been happening in my world.

You haven't been hearing a lot from me lately, and that's because I have been fairly seriously ill for the last several months.

In order to give you the complete picture, I need to go back over some material of which many of you are already aware, but this thing needs to be seen in its full context.

Last fall, I began to notice that I was having trouble catching my breath during exercise. Subsequent tests revealed a suspicious growth on my lymph nodes and left lung. This required an exploratory surgery called a Media Stenoscopy, which was performed At Cedars Sinai Hospital in late November of '07. The biopsy ultimately proved negative for any tumor, but there was a spot on the lung that still needed to be checked. Unfortunately, sometime during the operation, one of my lungs was nicked, and I developed Pneumothorax, which basically means that the lung collapsed, releasing all the air into my upper body, causing a condition called Subcutaneous Emphysema - Which blew me up like a balloon from the ribs up to my eyebrows. This happened three times over the next six days. The "cure" for this condition is to place chest tubes and small catheters under the skin to drain off the excess air.

Unfortunately, all that air also accumulated around my vocal cords, causing me to sound like an ambassador from Munchkinland. This condition, I was told, could last for a number of weeks.

We decided to put off a Bronchoscopy to determine the status of the spot on my lung until after the new year, by which time, my breathing had become even more labored.

Again, the test failed to reveal anything more than a few "suspicious" cells - but no cancer. I had also scheduled, months before, a standard Colonoscopy, which I had in January. This revealed a growth on my colon.

Are we having fun, yet?

So - I go back to Cedars to discuss laparoscopic surgery to get rid of that growth, after first undergoing CAT and PET scans. During my consultation with the surgeon, my Oncologist came in with another doctor to tell me that I had a tumor growing under my lung and threatening to encircle my Aortic Valve to my heart.

Suddenly, the surgery was put on hold, and I was scheduled for thirty-seven sessions of intense radiation and four sessions of Chemotherapy, which stretched over the next seven weeks. This included four blood transfusions.

During this time, the effects of the Subcutaneous Emphysema had worn off, and I was able to work

again.

After treatment, I was told that it was completely successful, and the growth had been completely eradicated! I was also told that the radiation therapy would continue to work in my system for a number of weeks.

Well, it did.

In rare cases - like mine - it spreads into the lungs and causes a very persistent condition called radiation pnuemonitis. This reduces the lungs capacity to about a quarter, making it almost impossible to walk ten paces without having to stop for air.

The treatment for this condition is massive doses of steroids, which balloons the face and body, and it also settles on the vocal cords in a major way, creating a good deal of gravel and hoarseness. In short - it has brought my career to a near stand-still.

Steroids can also have a major effect on one's heart rate, and blood sugar count - each of which sent me back to Cedars on two separate occasions for four and three day stays within a week of each other. Because of the blood sugar influence, I now have a temporary form of diabetes, and need to take insulin.

This condition will pass as soon as I get the pnuemonitis under control, but it's a balancing act between doses of steroids and insulin.

As I mentioned earlier, this lung thing is incredibly resistant, and to this date, I am still looking for some improvement.

I do work from time to time, but my voice is nowhere close to where I need it to be. Fortunately, I have incredibly faithful friends and clients who have shown me what loyalty really means by working with me, even in my diminished capacity.

I am now recovering from the recovery. When this is cleared up, I still am facing the laparoscopic stomach surgery, but that will be a cakewalk.

But the real point of all this is the Genisis of the condition. I was a smoker, on and off, for thirty years. I quit nearly twenty years ago, but that crap has a tendency to lie doggo in your system. It finally caught up with me, and as you've just read - it ain't pretty. For those of you who are in the Voice Over business, and you think that smoking is adding some wonderful quality to your instrument - WAKE UP! Quit! Today! Whoever you are - if you smoke - Stop! All you are adding is garbage to your vocal cords, and a nice deep layer of tar and poison on the linings of your lungs.

I tell you all this, because I need to clear the air, because there has been a lot of speculation out there, and because it should serve as a cautionary tale. Even though the growth on my lungs has been erased, there are still a few miles to go before I'm back to 100%. "



Want to get terrific practice on your voice-over skills and do something great at the same time?

Volunteer to read for the blind and visually-challenged.

AIRS L.A. has been doing this for years, and now it's easy to do if you have a home studio. Here's are some messages from Ed Fallin, the Director of AIRS L.A.:

Hello, All, It has been suggested that AIRS-LA begin producing short daily podcasts.

#### Why Have Short Daily Podcasts?

- Daily podcasts can bring many listeners to AIRS-LA on a continual basis, thereby making AIRS-LA more relevant, more "alive," and drawing the attention of regular listeners to other new podcasts as they are added to the site.
- Short podcasts are a minimal burden on volunteers. Words associated with this concept are "quick" and "easy."
- Short means 5 to 10 minutes. Longer is permissible but not sought.

### Who Will Do the Podcasts?

- It is believed that AIRS-LA has a resource that is not being used to its fullest. This resource is the estimated dozen or more volunteers who have their own recording equipment and studio and who have the time, energy, and <u>desire</u> to do more AIRS-LA podcasting than they are currently doing.
- Each volunteer will do a single day per week. (This is flexible.) Thus, each volunteer will do only one 5-minute or 10-minute podcast per week. (The duration of each podcast can vary, depending on the material, and can be shorter or longer than the nominal 5 or 10 minutes. For example, a Wednesday podcast might be 7 minutes long one week and 11 minutes long the next week. Thursday's podcast might be 8 minutes.)
- As mentioned, the podcasts will be quick and easy to prepare.

## What Subject(s) Will the Podcasts Cover?

- This important question must be answered before a group of volunteers to record the podcasts can be assembled.
- It is requested that each recipient of this e-mail submit his or her suggestions for podcast material. (Some of you will not. You will be quickly forgiven [probably].)
- Podcast material must be of broad interest and of a type not easily found on other media. Still, the volunteer must be able to find his or her material easily and quickly. The volunteer is not expected to write any material. Politics? Economics? Hollywood gossip? Movie reviews? Editorials? Commentary? Other?

- Daily podcasts most likely will rely on daily publications. These might be newspapers or blogs or other daily sources.
- There may be copyright issues to address.
- *The podcasts will be quick and easy to prepare.*

### A Day in the Life

A volunteer goes to the web site or publication that has the day's material. He or she quickly reviews the material for suitability. The volunteer then records and edits the material. The volunteer then sends the recording (probably an MP3 made through Audacity) to a designated destination. The volunteer then begins a cup of coffee and turns on the television -- or does something of equal or greater pleasure. All in all, the podcast takes anywhere from an estimated 30 minutes to an hour from start to finish. The volunteer is then done for a week! It was quick and easy!

## More Thoughts

- It is possible to record directly from a web page without having to print anything.

  One brings Audacity up on top of the web page and adjusts its location on the monitor screen to facilitate recording. That's what Windows is all about!
- Both local volunteers -- those close to the studio -- and distant volunteers -- those in all parts of this country and the world -- can participate in this effort. Imagine, for example, commentary from a London newspaper!
- Daily podcasts are supposed to be quick and easy to prepare.

## Final Word (and Plea)

We really, really, really need to choose one or more good subjects to be covered in daily podcasts. Please submit your suggestion(s) to the writer.

I almost forgot to mention: Production of daily podcasts is intended to be quick and easy.

Hello, All! This seems like a good time to see how many readers there are who are <u>eager</u> to participate in making short daily podcasts for AIRS-LA.

To refresh everyone's memory, here's a description of what a typical volunteer does for a short daily podcast: The volunteer records and edits a podcast of between 5 and 10 minutes' duration (it can be longer). This is done by 10 AM. The volunteer sends the podcast to a destination that gets it onto the AIRS-LA web site. The volunteer is then done for the rest of the week, since only a single podcast per volunteer per week is planned! It is estimated that making such a podcast will require between half an hour and an hour.

There are some important details:

- The volunteer must have, or must have ready access to, recording equipment and a quiet place for recording. The volunteer will <u>not</u> record at the studio but will, instead, record wherever the "quiet place" exists. This will, in most cases, be in his or her home.
- Podcast subject matter is currently undecided. There may be a single theme or a new theme every day, repeated week after week.
- The volunteer must have time to commit to his or her podcast for the foreseeable future and must be <u>eager</u> to do it.
- Repeating for emphasis: Each volunteer will be responsible for only one podcast per week.
- Volunteers do not need to be within easy driving distance of the Tarzana studio. He or she can be virtually anywhere as long as podcast material (such as from a newspaper web site) is available, as well as suitable recording equipment and a quiet environment.

#### What You Should Do

If you'd like to be one of our corps of short daily podcasters, let the writer know as soon as possible. If you know of someone who is not currently an AIRS-LA volunteer but would possibly like to participate, let that person know about this opportunity and urge him or her to contact the writer.

We've included some of the correspondence we sent out in our mid-month promo. We will share with you Don's letter explaining his condition and Don's best friend Paul Pape as he breaks the news to the world

Special thanks to Julie Williams for forwarding us Don's letter. Don explains his condition so eloquently and leaves us with a lasting message for all to hear. This may be hard to read after the fact but for those of you that want to know exactly what happened, it's all in here.

"I thought it was about time that I brought everybody up to speed with what's been happening in my world.

You haven't been hearing a lot from me lately, and that's because I have been fairly seriously ill for the last several months

In order to give you the complete picture, I need to go back over some material of which many of you are already aware, but this thing needs to be seen in its full context.

Last fall, I began to notice that I was having trouble catching my breath during exercise. Subsequent tests revealed a suspicious growth on my lymph nodes and left lung. This required an exploratory surgery called a Media Stenoscopy, which was performed At Cedars Sinai Hospital in late November of '07. The biopsy ultimately proved negative for any tumor, but there was a spot on the lung that still needed to be checked. Unfortunately, sometime during the operation, one of my lungs was nicked, and I developed Pneumothorax, which basically means that the lung collapsed, releasing all the air into my upper body, causing a condition called Subcutaneous Emphysema - Which blew me up like a balloon from the ribs up to my eyebrows. This happened three times over the next six days. The "cure" for this condition is to place chest tubes and small catheters under the skin to drain off the excess air.

Unfortunately, all that air also accumulated around my vocal cords, causing me to sound like an ambassador from Munchkinland. This condition, I was told, could last for a number of weeks.

We decided to put off a Bronchoscopy to determine the status of the spot on my lung until after the new year, by which time, my breathing had become even more labored.

Again, the test failed to reveal anything more than a few "suspicious" cells - but no cancer. I had also scheduled, months before, a standard Colonoscopy, which I had in January. This revealed a growth on my colon.

Are we having fun, yet?

So - I go back to Cedars to discuss laparoscopic surgery to get rid of that growth, after first undergoing CAT and PET scans. During my consultation with the surgeon, my Oncologist came in with another doctor to tell me that I had a tumor growing under my lung and threatening to encircle my Aortic Valve to my heart.

Suddenly, the surgery was put on hold, and I was scheduled for thirty-seven sessions of intense radiation and four sessions of Chemotherapy, which stretched over the next seven weeks. This included four blood transfusions.

During this time, the effects of the Subcutaneous Emphysema had worn off, and I was able to work again.

After treatment, I was told that it was completely successful, and the growth had been completely eradicated! I was also told that the radiation therapy would continue to work in my system for a number of weeks.

Well, it did.

In rare cases - like mine - it spreads into the lungs and causes a very persistent condition called radiation pnuemonitis. This reduces the lungs capacity to about a quarter, making it almost impossible to walk ten paces without having to stop for air.

The treatment for this condition is massive doses of steroids, which balloons the face and body, and it also settles on the vocal cords in a major way, creating a good deal of gravel and hoarseness. In short - it has brought my career to a near stand-still.

Steroids can also have a major effect on one's heart rate, and blood sugar count - each of which sent me back to Cedars on two separate occasions for four and three day stays within a week of each other. Because of the blood sugar influence, I now have a temporary form of diabetes, and need to take insulin.

This condition will pass as soon as I get the pnuemonitis under control, but it's a balancing act between doses of steroids and insulin.

As I mentioned earlier, this lung thing is incredibly resistant, and to this date, I am still looking for some improvement.

I do work from time to time, but my voice is nowhere close to where I need it to be. Fortunately, I have incredibly faithful friends and clients who have shown me what loyalty really means by working with me, even in my diminished capacity.

I am now recovering from the recovery. When this is cleared up, I still am facing the laparoscopic stomach surgery, but that will be a cakewalk.

But the real point of all this is the Genisis of the condition. I was a smoker, on and off, for thirty

years. I quit nearly twenty years ago, but that crap has a tendency to lie doggo in your system. It finally caught up with me, and as you've just read - it ain't pretty. For those of you who are in the Voice Over business, and you think that smoking is adding some wonderful quality to your instrument - WAKE UP! Quit! Today! Whoever you are - if you smoke - Stop! All you are adding is garbage to your vocal cords, and a nice deep layer of tar and poison on the linings of your lungs.

I tell you all this, because I need to clear the air, because there has been a lot of speculation out there, and because it should serve as a cautionary tale. Even though the growth on my lungs has been erased, there are still a few miles to go before I'm back to 100%. "

In a quite sudden reversal of the progress he had been making the last few days, Don took ill again and passed away at around 1:50PM this afternoon (9/1/08).

Yeah I can't believe it - normally when I hear of passings of people I don't know on a personal level, obviously it's sad but it doesn't usually effect me more then that.
